"Crisis management is always a team effort," says the winner in the "Education" category in the voting organized by Leadersnet.

Vienna, December 28, 2021 – Competent crisis managers are particularly important in the neverending corona crisis. In the face of unprecedented challenges, it is also important for universities to maintain calm and an overview as well as to make the right decisions. This makes the victory of Michael Heritsch, CEO of FHWien der WKW, in the "Education" category of Leadersnet's "Crisis Manager 2021" election even more gratifying.

High-quality education even in a pandemic

"Crisis management is always a team effort," emphasizes Michael Heritsch. "That's why the award is also due to the entire crisis management team at our university of applied sciences." Only together, he says, was it possible to maintain academic operations at the usual level of quality – despite frequently changing conditions and long lockdown phases. Evaluation by expert jury and audience

In the election of the "Crisis Manager 2021" organized by Leadersnet, around 400 managers of Austrian companies and organizations from 14 industries could be voted for. The areas of "digital competence", "ability and credibility" and "flexibility" were surveyed. The evaluation was made using a star system. The result was based on the assessment of a jury of experts as well as a public survey in which 30,000 people cast their votes.
