

Society & Emotion: What Do We Learn from Current Crises?

The panel discussion with political scientist Natascha Strobl and business ethicists Thomas Beschorner and Markus Scholz will take place on May 10, 2022 at FHWien der WKW.

Vienna, May 4, 2022 – Human rights violations, climate crisis, Covid pandemic and the attack on Ukraine: How do we react in permanent crisis mode to events that are influenced by fake news and interpreted in amazingly different ways?

Research shows that unconscious basic assumptions influence perception and reasoning. Thus, no one is immune to distortions in their own perceptions. These distortions inhibit the ability to find a shared common ground or to stay in discourse. Followership, online trolls and social bots reinforce this effect. This is because social media and filter bubbles create supposed clarity through permanent repetition. Suddenly, facts play a seemingly secondary role, unless they can be emotionalized. The emotionalized human being, homo sapiens emotionalis, shapes his environment. Crises are not only a challenge for our society, because new circumstances also offer new opportunities.

After a keynote speech by political scientist Natascha Strobl, she will discuss the question with business ethicists Thomas Beschorner and Markus Scholz: What do we learn from current crises?
